Features of Fukuoka.

Fukuoka City is located on the island of Kyushu, the southwestern most of Japan's four major islands. With a population of about 1.5 million, it is a city built on commerce and has developed as the cultural and commercial center of the island.

Courses

ASSOCIATE DIPLOMA PROGRAM

After completing the full 2-year program, you will receive an Associate Diploma. The course will be carried out for two years or 1700 hours of study. After completion, you can use this degree to find full-time work provided that you also have a bachelor's degree in Japan*. The enrollment for this 2-year program is in April.

Japanese Department

This course includes standard lessons, JLPT preparation and cultural activities throughout the year. The enrollment for the 1.5-year course is in October and the 2-year course begins in April. There is also a 1-year course that starts from April & October. Applicants must have completed at least 12 years of education (high school diploma) in their country or foreign country and have completed 150 hours of basic Japanese language study with certificate or Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) 5. A letter of recommendation is also acceptable (specific countries) in case the applicant is taking Japanese lessons from a private teacher.

International Cultural Department

Advanced Study Course

This course prepares students to further their studies at a national / public university, prominent private university, or graduate school. After brushing up on Japanese during the first year, students spend the second year of this course preparing for further study at a university or graduate school. This program develops essay writing and reading ability as well as focuses on academic Japanese language and listening skills for university-level study. It is offered in a 1 year or 2-year term*.

International Business Course

International Hotel Department

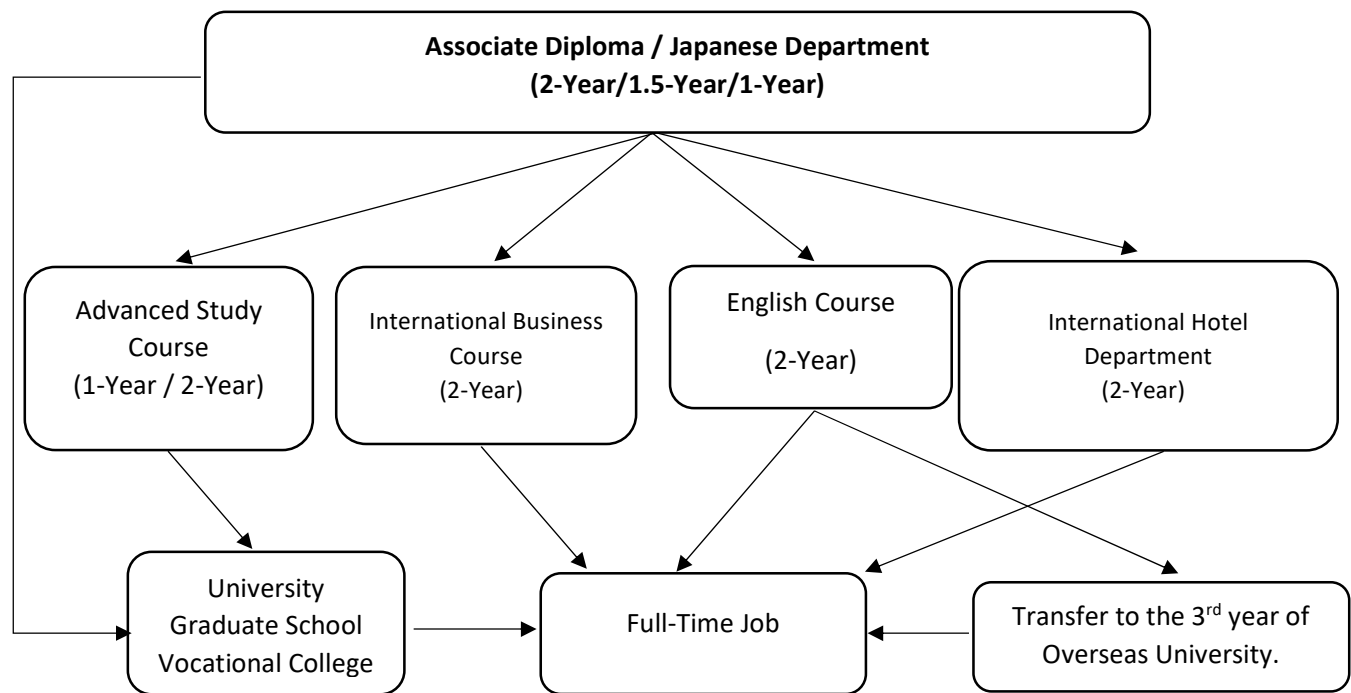

Accommodation Facilities

Our college dormitory is particularly convenient and a cheap option for the students to reside. Currently we have a dormitory for our students with single & shared room facilities. By bicycle, it takes about 5 to 10 minutes from the dorm to the college. In addition, public transport is available. Each room is fitted with modern equipment including an attached toilet and bath. Communal kitchens and laundry room facilities are also available. Wi-Fi internet access is offered for our students in dorm rooms. Students will experience a complete international environment by living together and making new friends.

Employment Support

Students are allowed to do a part-time job outside of their study. We have a professional staff readily available dedicated to the employment support. Students can work up to 28 hours per 7 days during school and up to 40 hours per 7 days during long vacation periods. Because we are collaborating with many Japanese companies, after graduation there are numerous opportunities to get a full-time job through and by being associated with our school.



FFLC Adventure Club

Other than regular study, FFLC organizes over 100 cultural, social and sports events every year. We have the 'FFLC Adventure Club' where we organize different types of activities for our students. Most of them are free of cost. This is a very rare thing in Japan. You may not find such extracurricular activities in other vocational colleges.



Important Information for the Prospective Students

1. Please note that FFLC conducts Japanese and other courses in Japanese language. There is no other language support available in the class.
2. For the Japanese language courses, we have lessons on reading, writing, listening, and speaking according to our curriculum. We do not emphasize on specific section such as Listening or speaking. Students should be aware of that before enrollment.
3. From now on, all the students need to take the J.TEST exam after enrollment at FFLC. This is the Govt. rule that all the students must appear and pass any recognized exam after coming to Japan within 1 year. So FFLC will prepare them for J.TEST exam.
4. Students should inform FFLC beforehand regarding special cases (like handicapped, physically challenged etc.). Of course, we know that many students do not like to talk about that. However, they suffer more after coming to the school while we place them with other students. To prevent such cases, we require pre information about the students. Most likely, we may not have special support for those students so far.
